We had a change in leadership halfway through the year. This change in leadership greatly impacted our activities this year.

Objective 1 - Collaborate with other interest networks.

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> In partnership with AAIDD leadership, the assembly, and the SECP, evaluate the process of travel award membership to enhance efficiency, impact, and equity of awards.

What we did: Due to change in leadership halfway through the year, we did not address this goal. We did meet with SECP several times to plan the Research Colloquium and discuss scholarships.

Objective 2 – Support students.

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> Provide financial support for travel awards to AAIDD, with a focus on students and early career professionals interested in research.

<u>Planned activity 2:</u> Co-host SECP pre-conference Research Colloquium, and collaborate with SECP leadership to create a program that best meets the needs of diverse students and early career professionals.

<u>What we did-Planned activity 1:</u> The executive committee invited RIN members at-large to review 28 abstracts submitted by SECP individuals. RIN members and leadership reviewed abstracts, with each abstract reviewed by at least 1 RIN leadership member. Based on the average ranking, the RIN awarded travel awards to two students: Neev Shah, University of Louisville, School of Medicine and Elizabeth Stone, Rutger University

What we did- Planned activity 2: 24 individuals attended this event, with 6 students presenting (2 accepted students were unable to attend).

Funds used: \$1,000 (\$500 each travel award)

<u>Planned activity 1:</u> The RIN will co-sponsor webinars/seminars held by RIN members to advance scientific knowledge and resources.

<u>Planned activity 2:</u> The RIN will explore opportunities to co-sponsor webinars/seminars with other related organizations (e.g., AUCD, IDDRC) to enhance collaboration and dissemination in the field.

What we did- Planned activity 1: The RIN co-sponsored one webinar about Research Ethics for All.

What we did- Planned activity 2: Not completed this year; recommended as a goal for next year.
