POSITION OVERVIEW

The Director will ensure that all residential programs comply with applicable state and federal regulations, maintain fiscal responsibility, and reflect the highest standards of ethical and person-centered practices. This is a **unique opportunity** to build a transformative continuum of care from the ground up by collaborating closely with families, staff, community partners, and other stakeholders.

The **Director of Residential Services** is a senior leadership role charged with spearheading the strategic growth, operational excellence, and innovation of VIA's residential and sponsored residential programs serving adults with autism and related neurodevelopmental disabilities. This visionary leader will **direct the expansion of existing sponsored residential homes** and **develop a diverse array of residential solutions**—including supported living arrangements, group homes, and potentially a purpose-built residential community—that prioritize autonomy, inclusion, person-centered care, and quality of life.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Program Expansion and Oversight

- Lead the management and continuous improvement of VIA's current sponsored residential services, ensuring exceptional care, quality, regulatory compliance, and adherence to fiscal and operational goals.
- Strategically expand residential offerings to increase capacity and diversify living options, fostering inclusive, community-integrated environments.

New Residential Program Development

- Conceptualize, design, and implement innovative residential service models including supported living and group homes—guided by best practices and individualized support needs.
- Develop and maintain comprehensive policies, compliance procedures, staffing models, and budgets aligned with program objectives and regulatory requirements.

Vision and Strategic Planning

- Articulate and drive a long-term vision for residential services that anticipates and responds to evolving community needs and advances in neurodevelopmental care.
- Engage and collaborate with families, staff, board members, and external partners to define and align strategic priorities.

Project Leadership

- Oversee all phases of residential program development, including planning, licensing, facility design, and implementation.
- Ensure projects meet timelines, budgets, quality standards, and all applicable licensing and regulatory frameworks.

Community Engagement and Advocacy

- Build and sustain strong partnerships with government agencies, providers, advocacy organizations, and community stakeholders to enhance service capacity and visibility.
- Collaborate with VIA's advancement team to identify and secure funding streams, grants, and partnerships that support program growth and sustainability.
- Represent VIA at public forums, industry events, and advocacy efforts to promote inclusive housing and support services for individuals with disabilities.

- Bachelor's degree in Human Services, Social Work, Psychology, or a related field required; Master's degree preferred.
- Minimum of 7 years of progressive supervisory experience within developmental disability or autism services, including at least 5 years in residential service delivery.
- Prior management experience with sponsored residential services in Virginia is strongly preferred.
- In-depth knowledge of Medicaid Waiver services, Virginia licensing standards, and regulatory compliance.
- Proven track record in launching or expanding residential programs, demonstrating strong project management, operational execution, and problem-solving skills.

VIA Centers for Neurodevelopment (formerly Virginia Institute of Autism) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization headquartered in Charlottesville, Virginia. Founded in 1996 by parents of children with autism, VIA uses its decades of combined expertise to translate science into service with approaches that are tailored to each individual and their family.

VIA currently serves individuals, families, and communities across central and southwest Virginia at our centers in Charlottesville, Roanoke, Lynchburg, and Lexington.

OUR MISSION

VIA's mission is to empower people to embrace the strengths and meet the challenges related to autism and neurodevelopmental disabilities by providing compassionate, evidence-based services throughout their lives.

OUR VISION

We envision a world in which individuals, families, and communities support, embrace, and celebrate the differences related to autism and neurodevelopmental disabilities so that all lead more fulfilling lives.

OUR APPROACH

VIA employs state-of-the-art, evidence-based approaches, built around the principles of Applied Behavior Analysis tailored for each individual and their family. Through our collaborative partnerships with premier colleges, universities, and institutes of higher education, we develop innovative services that result in meaningful and profound changes in the lives of the people we serve.

With our Day School Services, Adult Services, and Behavioral Health Services, VIA addresses the unique learning challenges of the individuals we serve throughout their lifespan.

RECOGNITION

The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), calls VIA's programs "a gold standard for the field." VIA has consistently earned 3-year CARF accreditation across programs and 5-year Virginia Association of Independent Specialized Education Facilities (VAISEF) accreditation.









OUR ADULT PROGRAMS

Where every individual can live, work, and play to their fullest potential.

CLUB & HUB

VIA's Club & Hub helps adults develop friendships, enhance well-being, engage in civic activities, and express creative abilities. All members partake in a combination of Club & Hub programs and outings based on their interests, likes, and abilities. "Club" members join in group activities at VIA programs while "Hub" members participate in community outings. The Club & Hub program is licensed to provide Adult Day Support and Community Engagement services by the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS). This program is typically funded through Medicaid Waivers.

ACHIEVE EMPLOYMENT

VIA's Achieve Employment service supports adults in preparing for and securing competitive, integrated employment. Through vocational assessments, work readiness training, and individualized job coaching, the VIA team helps participants build the skills needed for success across a range of employment settings. Services are typically funded by the Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services (DARS).

VIABLE VENTURES

The VIAble Ventures program offers vocational training and meaningful work experiences for individuals who are not yet ready for community-based employment or who prefer to work in a supportive, small business setting. Participants develop job skills by helping to create handcrafted candles, screen-printed handbags and coffee mugs, and bath salts—products that are sold online and at local stores and farmers markets. All participants are paid at least minimum wage for their work, providing them with the dignity of earning a paycheck while gaining valuable experience and a sense of purpose.

BEHAVIORAL CONSULTATION

The Behavioral Consultation program provides licensed Behavior Analysts to support individuals and their caregivers in home, work, or community settings. Through personalized strategies, individuals build meaningful skills to meet their unique behavioral goals, while caregivers receive hands-on training and ongoing support to reinforce progress. This service is funded through the Medicaid Waiver as Therapeutic Consultation and is licensed and overseen by the DBHDS.

SPONSORED RESIDENTIAL

In 2023, VIA became a licensed Sponsored Residential provider through the DBHDS in response to the needs of a high-support individual graduating from VIA's day school. Leveraging its deep experience with Medicaid and DBHDS regulations, as well as its existing licenses for adult waiver services, VIA is well positioned to deliver high-quality residential care. VIA currently manages all Medicaid billing, pays sponsors a daily stipend from Medicaid reimbursement, and ensures compliance with all state documentation requirements. VIA is actively seeking a leader to help expand this vital service beyond the one individual currently served.









THE FUTURE AT VIA

Answering the Call: Residential Services



VIA recently completed a multimillion dollar comprehensive campaign resulting in new and renovated facilities across all four of its locations. This campaign nearly doubled the capacity of VIA's school programs, expanded adolescent and adult services, and bolstered all programs throughout Virginia. VIA is now ready to launch the exciting possibility of adult residential services.

"This campaign bolstered our current programs and provided spacious new facilities customized for our students and adults," said Alison Webb, VIA co-founder and parent. It positions VIA to meet the challenges that lie ahead as we develop long-term residential services."

THE CASE EXAMPLE

When David and Donna Cattell-Gordon joined forces with Bernie and Alison Webb in 1996 to co-found the Virginia Institute of Autism, their young children were among the school's first students. As they grew up, VIA grew along with them and has since served thousands of children and adults with neurodevelopmental disorders.

Daniel Cattell-Gordon came to VIA as a 2-year-old. Now in his early 30s, Daniel is a 7-foot-tall "huggable, gentle giant," as described by his father, David.

"VIA has been a school for Daniel, there's been work for Daniel here, there have been meaningful relationships for Daniel, and there is community for Daniel — who could have ever imagined the bridges that have been built?" asked David.



"But what remains is making a home for Daniel, one which endures after I am gone."

VIA has a long history of rising to meet the needs of its families. Creating a lifetime home where adults like Daniel can live within a caring and supportive community that meets the specialized requirements of its residents is our next great challenge.


